Udaan's unique audience includes students in and outside of the UIUC campus, nationwide members from the Desi Dance Network, and performers and audience members of Udaan itself, summing to outreach to approximately 12,000 people. Our event is open and free to the general public, specifically catered towards UIUC students, and is marketed on multiple social media platforms, months prior to the event.
- Team/Judges Application process:

- Prior to hosting our 8 competing teams, we have an extensive application process. This past year we had 70+ teams apply with their audition video, and we had a 2 day long viewing of these videos, in which a board of 15 of our members watched and judged, until we had our final 8 teams selected. The process is quite competitive, due to the limited number of spots available and the increasing amounts of talent and creativity we see every year.
- These 8 competitive teams are then judged at our competition by 5-6 extremely qualified judges from various dance backgrounds. We reach out to well known dancers, and dance teams to gauge interest in judging, and we then select from a pool of applicants. We try to balance the panel by having judges with different dance backgrounds, experiences, and expertise to be able to provide the competing teams with a broad range of judges in the panel so that all their ideas, choreography, and creativity is equally and correctly judged to ensure a fair competition.
- Competition Weekend:
- Every team is given 3 liaisons which are all University of Illinois Urbana Champaign students. These individuals relay information about our competitions times and events and guide the performers around our campus. Udaan hosts two major events. The first event, "The Mixer" is held the night before the competition. At the mixer, there is dinner served to the dancers, games set up, and a grand welcoming to our campus. The purpose of this mixer is to have all the dancers be able to meet the rest of the teams invited to the competition, and play games in which we determine the show order for the competition the next day. The following day, teams wake up bright and early to come to our show's tech rehearsal time. From there, we provide breakfast, lunch, and tons of water for these individuals to make sure they are well-nourished throughout the exhilarating weekend. After tech time, teams get ready at their hotels until its show time. During show time, we have each team perform their 10-minute long dance sets. We have a photographer set up a livestream for the thousands of people involved in the dance circuit to log in and watch, a DJ to run the music, and exhibition acts to showcase University of Illinois' talent. The judge's carefully deliberate and speak to our national managers to finalize their scoring rubric and prepare to announce the placements of the competition. Once the show is over, we allow our teams to celebrate themselves and their performance by exploring our campus! The following day, the team members fly back/depart Champaign and go back to their University's with the best image of UIUC

- Event Description: "The Asian American Association Fashion Show is an annual dance showcase held at Foellinger Auditorium. The showcase is AAA's largest annual event, dedicated to empowering Asian American identity through various creative mediums. We invite both AAA and non-AAA members to perform together, opening opportunities to dancers of all experiences and backgrounds. As dancers, members can join three different dance-style groups: Throwback, Cultural, and Night Life. Each group features Asian music artists around lyrical and pop, traditional, hip-hop and R&B genres. Our traditional dance group will perform dances from all over Asia. This year, we will be diving into traditional Chinese, Polenesian, and Korean dances. To give our audience authentic traditional performances, our props will include Chinese bamboo and fan and Polenesian glow-sticks. All of our traditional performances will also include outfits respective to its culture and worn by our dancers. Therefore, our props such as the glowsticks, ultras, and PCV pipes will be used for our Polynesian glow-sticks performance. Also known as Poi, it is a performance art that originated from the Maori people and is known for swinging tethered weights in order to create geometric shapes. We will be able to create such shapes through the attachment of glow-sticks and ultras to strings and PVC pipes. Our long fan, Chinese outfit (Hanfu), and Chinese bamboo will be used for our Chinese dance. Water Sleeves are commonly worn underneath Hanfu or other traditional Chinese styled clothing. The Hanfu chosen pairs nicely with the purple-white ombre color, as well as the contemporary, playful choice of song. Instead of the staple grandiose, majestic style, this Hanfu is more lightweight and flowy, matching the needs of this particular choreography with more room for floor and leg work. Although the main character of this style of dance is the water sleeves, having an attractive Hanfu also serves the purpose of being aesthetically pleasing. As for our Korean outfit (Hanbok), it will be used to perform our traditional Korean dance with a modern music blend as well. The dance is a remix of K-Pop group Oneus, Luna, into a traditional performance taking place in the Joseon Dynasty, Korea.
- As our media team works on the films, we will also be holding 1-2 dance practices through the weeks leading up to the showcase. 1 hour on the weekday and 2 hours on the weekend. These practices will be essential in preparing our dancers for the showcase. In the week before the show, we will have a lock-in that will help familiarize our performers with stage spacing, desired lighting, and tech coordination. On the day before the show and during the showcase day itself, dress rehearsals will be held to finalize a cohesive run-through of Fashion Show.
- Additionally, we will host a runway. Since we used to do runways, we would like to bring them back to our showcase. The runway will consist of thrifted clothes that members design and buy as well as props for on-stage. These outfits will showcase different decades from the 80s to the present, representing our theme, Radiant Generation. Generation is a time of adaptation where the old and new learn from each other. In this diverse era, people from various backgrounds transition and regain what's lost. Time changes, and we're now radiant. Through this runway, we would like to showcase how we shine in each generation.
- Besides our dance and runway portions, we also invite 5-10 campus RSOs as guest performers to showcase their skills in dancing, martial arts, instrumentation, etc. We open an application for any RSOs to audition for a spot in our showcase and in the weeks leading up to the big performance, we hold dress rehearsals. Traditionally, we have invited Wushu, Taekwondo, TASC, VSA, and a few Asian sororities and fraternities. The purpose of having guest performers is to bring together the Asian community and show all of our unique talents
